

They guide your doctor and other health care professionals, and relieve your family and friends from the burden of guessing what types of care and treatment you would want to receive.

Lifeline & Link-Up Programs

Lifeline and Link-Up are programs designed to help low income people or on a fixed income, reduce their phone bill and assist with telephone service connection and installation. Eligible customers must be in a household that receives benefits from: W2, Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Food Share, Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, WI Homestead Tax Credit, and/or BadgerCare.

(This program does not assist with past-due bills.)

To apply, contact your local telephone company and say you want to apply for the Lifeline & Link-Up programs for Wisconsin.

NOTE: You can receive Lifeline discounts on only one telephone number – either wireless **or** wireline but **not both** – per household. LONG-TERM CARE FUNDING

Long-term care is help with daily living tasks and health needs because of one's advanced age, chronic illness or an intellectual or physical disability. This help can include different services, such as personal care, housekeeping or nursing. Long-term care is provided in people's homes, in small and large residential facilities, in nursing facilities and in the workplace. Long-term care funding programs have certain functional and financial criteria that must be met in order to be eligible.

Family Care Program

Family Care offers a wide variety of long-term care services, making it possible for seniors and adults with physical and/or developmental disabilities to live more independently at home or other community setting. Family Care allows services to be tailored to a person's needs, circumstances and preferences. Members will continue choosing their own physicians while Family Care provides you with the added long term care support.

Family Care Partnership Program

Family Care Partnership offers a wide variety of long-term care healthcare services, making it possible for seniors and adults with physical and/or developmental disabilities to live more independently at home or other community setting. The Family Care Partnership Program integrates a full range of long-term, primary, acute and preventive care through the use of interdisciplinary teams. The result is participants with complex health needs receive comprehensive, continuous, total care that addresses their changing needs. Participants must receive all routine care from a network of healthcare providers.

IRIS (Include, Respect, I Self-Direct) Program

IRIS allows you or your guardian to choose, control and design their support and service plan to meet your functional, vocational, medical and social needs. With IRIS, you have control over the type of services you receive at home or in your community residence. IRIS is grounded in the core values of self-determination:

- Freedom to decide how you want to live your life
- Authority to purchase services within a specific budget
- Support to organize resources in ways that are life enhancing and meaningful to you
- Responsibility for wise use of public dollars and recognition of the contribution you make to your community
- Confirmation of the important role of self-advocates
